- All ticket exchanges require the original ticket to be returned to the box office.



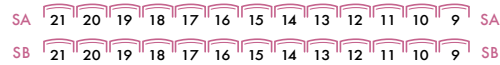
Accessibility

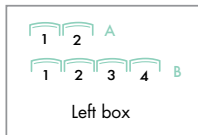
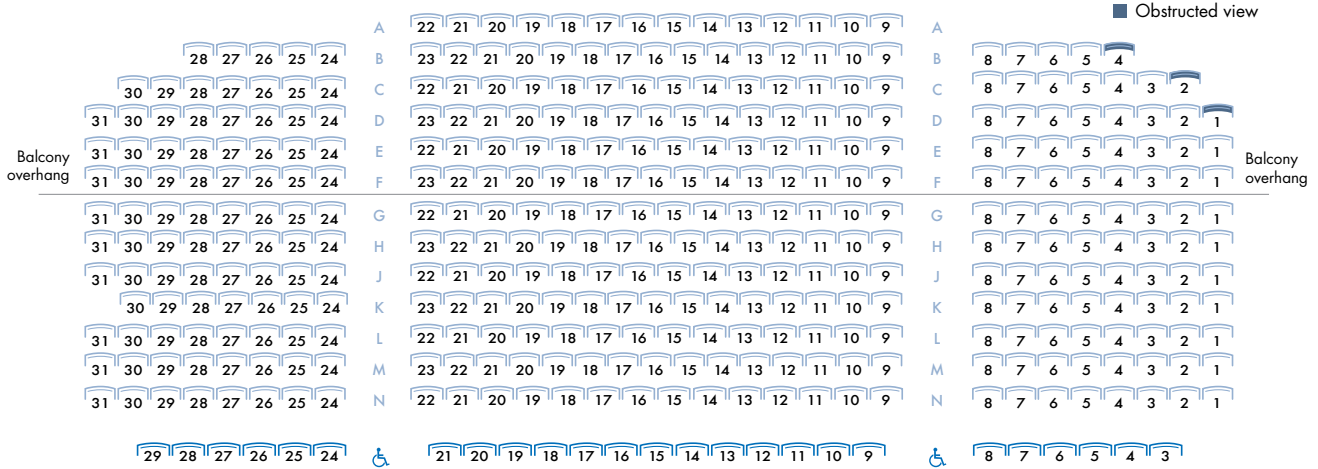
Seating Chart

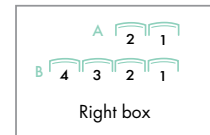
